Mission of the Boy Scouts of America

The mission of the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law.

Goal of Pack 943

Originally established in 1972, the goal of Pack 943 is to carry out the mission of the BSA which also includes teaching leadership, citizenship, fitness, and environmental awareness and stewardship. We want to provide a safe and FUN Cub Scout experience for each and every boy or girl and their families! We encourage the youth to live by the Cub Scout motto (Do your best!) while facing new challenges, trying new things, and serving the community. We hope to motivate the Cubs to continue their experience as members of Scouts BSA.

The Family

Scouting is not just about the Scout, but about their family as well. Pack 943 places a very strong emphasis on family involvement. We highly encourage the whole family to participate in Pack events, including monthly pack meetings, outings, hikes, and celebrations. Youth joining the Pack as Lion or Tiger Cubs must have at least one adult family member present at all activities. The Cub Scout Ranks

As Cub Scouts, youth are placed in units called a "Den" according to their school grade level*. Regardless of what age a scout begins their Cub Scouting experience, they must first earn their Bobcat Badge. Below is the list of ranks and grade:



Bobcat: First badge earned by all Cub Scouts

Lion: Kindergarten (not Transitional)

Tiger:1st GradeWolf:2nd GradeBear:3rd GradeWebelos:4th GradeArrow of Light:5th Grade

*Girls will be members of a same-gender den of mixed ages.

Meetings & Activities

Cub Scouts are expected to attend and participate in 2-3 formal meetings a month, which may vary by Den. The two most important gatherings are 1) Den meetings and 2) Pack meetings. In addition to these meetings, we will gather for other special activities planned throughout the year.

Den Meetings: Den meetings are typically held two times a month at a location selected by the Den Leader(s). Both meetings are focused on rank specific advancement activities with one of them usually at a home, school or park. The other is often a visit to a special location related to the Adventure the Scouts are working on.

Pack Meetings: Pack 943 has a monthly Pack meeting that is typically scheduled for the 3rd Tuesday of the month in the Donlon Multi-purpose Room (MPR) from 7pm-8:30pm. This does vary based on the calendar year and holidays.

Special Events: Throughout the year the Scouts participate in many activities as part of, or separate from, our monthly meetings. Some of these activities include:

- Overnight Camping (Fall/Spring)
- Camping Connection (October, new Scouts)
- Pleasanton Holiday Parade (December Pack Meeting)
- Pinewood Derby (January Pack Meeting)
- Raingutter Regatta (September Pack Meeting)
- Scouting for Food (November)
- Tiger Cub Pumpkin Patch & Kite Days
- Blue & Gold Banquet (February Pack Meeting)

Outdoor Activities

Getting outdoors is a core component of being a Scout. This includes overnight camping at locations within the local area organized by Pack 943 or directly by SFBAC at one of the council's outstanding Scout camps. Learn more at www.sfbac.org/camping.

Camping: Pack 943 strives to schedule at least two pack-wide overnight camping events each year. This has included Oakland Zoo, the USS Hornet, Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk, and various East Bay Park District campgrounds. Camping events usually include advancement activities, so Scouts are highly encouraged to participate.

Pack Hikes: Optional SFBAC Trail Trekkers Program hikes are planned monthly, typically on a Sunday afternoon around 2pm. Scouts who complete the hike are awarded a Trail Trekkers segment patch. To learn more about the Trail Trekker program, go to www.sfbac.org/programs/hiking.

Cub Scout Uniforms

Scouts are required to come to all meetings and activities in their full dress Class "A" uniform unless otherwise specified to wear their Pack 943 T-Shirt and hat (Class B). Families are responsible for purchasing the required components of the Class-A uniform. Uniforms can be purchased at the East Bay Scout Shop in San Leandro or Dom's Outdoors in Livermore.

Costs & Fees

Scouting is run by adult volunteers, but Pack Fees are required to cover the costs of maintaining our unit charter, BSA insurance, adult uniforms, leader training, facilities, activities and various logistics.

Fundraising: Annual Cub Scout popcorn sales are critical to maintaining the Pack budget and all Scouts are expected to participate as best they can. Sales are September through October.

Change of Rank (May): \$50 (approx. w/tax)
