Safety Moments

Safety Moments are exactly what the name implies: opportunities to prepare for an activity, review safety measures and report incidents correctly.

Safety Moments should be delivered at the beginning of all scout meetings such as roundtable, committee meetings, unit meetings or an activity in order to discuss a hazard or risk that can be prevented. The safety moment focuses the attention of the group on safety.

The BSA publishes safety moments or you can create your own which is appropriate for a specific activity. Topics can focus on a checklist of things to do, youth protection, a specific topic or even safety and evacuation routes of your meeting place.

Keep in mind the following points when preparing a safety moment:

- Every youth or leader, with preparation, could deliver the safety moment.
- Safety moments should be delivered in a few minutes.
- Keep it simple and easy to understand.
- Help the group know how to apply the safety message.

Activity Planning & Risk Assessment

As warmer weather is coming, many units will begin planning fun and exciting outdoor activities. For those activities that support the values of the Boy Scouts of America, there are several tools available for participants that will help them plan for a fun and safe tour, activity, or event. Good planning and preparedness prior to executing the activity is key to success.

As you use these tools, reflect on the words of Robert Baden-Powell: Be Prepared ... the meaning of the motto is that a Scout must prepare themself by previous thinking and practicing how to act in an accident or emergency so that they are never taken by surprise. In order to do this, the BSA has provided three tools for leaders to ensure their outings are not only fun but also safe.

Program Hazard Analysis

This tool is primarily used for program areas within camp properties, camps or high-adventure bases. It covers specific risks to the program areas. This tool has a defined way of assessing probability and severity of risks. This tool assesses risks initially, as if there are no protective measures in place, then looks at the risks again with protective measures. Reference: www.scouting.org/filestore/pdf/680-009.pdf

Safety PAUSE

The Safety PAUSE process stresses the importance of a last-minute safety check in the field. By encouraging each youth or adult leader to pause and reflect on the tasks at hand just before beginning, you have an opportunity to take necessary precautions to prevent any present or potential hazards. 
