



Annual Recharter

- Annual recharter process opened as of Monday, October 2nd
- The process is completely online and available at Internet Advancement
- <u>GGAC's YPT policy is stricter</u> than the National BSA policy
- YPT and AB506 certification must be valid through the entire calendar year 2024 at time of recharter
- The new AB506 training can be accessed from the California Scouting website
- YPT & AB506 status for all registered members is always available on <u>Dropbox</u>.

Internet Advancement Calendar

The calendar in Internet Advancement has all the features you are familiar with in Scoutbook as well as some added features, such as support for recurring meetings. We have also programmed it so that it will be easier to add features and integrate the calendar with activity logs.

The Internet Advancement Calendar shares the same back end database with Scoutbook Calendar, so events scheduled using one will be visible and editable in the other.

There are improvements in the IA calendar as well! They include a new integration of activities & events and support for recurring events.

Scoutbook calendar will be retired by November 2nd to give users a chance to familiarize themselves with Internet Advancement Calendar and its new features.



Recharter

2024 will bring a new charter renewal process. This process involves scout leaders and parents as never before. Changes to the individual registration process began August 1, 2023. There are no changes to the unit charter renewal process until March 2024. Beginning March 2024 Membership renewal will no I onger be tied to the unit charter process

Lets answer a few questions about recharter:

WHAT IS A RECHARTER?

Most Scouting units "belong" to a local organization like a school, religious institution or service club. The objectives, mission and methodologies of a chartered organization are compatible with those of the BSA. It agrees to use the Scouting program to further its mission to serve young people. The unit and local organization form together to officially charter a unit with the BSA. All units currently registered with the BSA need to complete this re-registration process on a yearly basis - this is a recharter.

HOW DOES A UNIT RECHARTER?

A unit should work closely with their unit commissioner and district executive to complete the online process through their council by:

- Preparing early with membership and youth protection training inventories
- Collecting membership fees
- Selecting a unit recharter champion to guide the unit along
- Reviewing all available online resources
- Allowing sufficient time for council to process the charter renewal

UNIT RENEWAL

- Units rechartering in 2023 have no changes. They will renew charter and membership as always. Existing members will renew their membership during charter renewal until March of 2024
- Beginning March 2023 units will renew their charters separately from their membership
- The online system will validate the unit leadership and verify the unit has the minimum required youth and adults. The Unit COR and council will approve the leadership, the unit will approve the charter and will submit the annual charter renewal fee of \$100

- Units with February 2024 expiration must have the charter renewed by the end of March. The charter will automatically lapse at the end of March. The unit and members will still have a February expiration date.
- Units with March to December 2024 expiration will renew charters and memberships under the new system,

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

Membership Renewal changes beginning August 1, 2023

- All new youth and adults members will join for a 12-month membership cycle. Both youth and adults will pay the fall annual membership fee to join Scouting and will renew their membership on the anniversary month of joining
- Each member, youth or adult, will renew their membership on their anniversary month. Many will have an anniversary that is the month their unit renewed last, and any new members will renew 12 months after they joined. Proration has been eliminated.
- Units will have access to reporting in My. Scouting for members due to renew, members renewed, and members dropped)opt-out)
- Until WILL BE able to choose to pay renewals for all members, this option will black the online payment by the parent. Prepared. For Life."

- Membership renewals will be completed either by credit card with a 12 month renewal payment from the individual, by a scout unit that has elected "Unit will pay all our members renewals "option, or by a manual payment at the council office.
- Units and members will begin receiving notification va email 60 days prior to the membership renewal month, my.scouting.org emails will be used for notifications
- All registered adults must take Youth Protection Training (YPT) every year. If a volunteer's YPT is not current charter renewal the volunteer cannot be renewed.

Recruitment, Retention & Membership

The sounds of Scouting activities ring through the air in every season of the year. Laughter, leadership, learning, and growing all mark the path of young people across America as they develop into those who will change the future. The common theme is not the mountains or the woods, not the campfires or the competitions - it's the smiles and personalities themselves, those joyous moments of challenge, breakthrough and success, and it all starts with the amazing word - YES!

This is the word that rings in the hearts of both youth and adults acvross the nation as the flyers come home from school, or the friend invites a buddy to join a group get together at a Scout meeting. The vision and mission of the BSA is to prepare all youth "to make ethical and moral choices.... by instilling in them the Scout Oath and Law". ALL YOUTH! As Scouts and Scouters it is our responsibility to share this amazing program with everyone we know, giving them the opportunity to say YES to a great adventure!

Now is an amazing time to get everyone involved in sharing the adventure of Scouting! Here are some great ideas to get you started!

- Have a presence at school open house nights, meet the teacher nights, PTA meetings, church or community events. Offer to pick up trash, direct traffic, or any other service that might be of value to an organization.
- Business cards with Pack or Troop information are easy to hand out while folks are in line at events or for students to hang out to their friends. Include a QR code with a link to your units website or your Be a Scout Pin!
- Use incentives Scouts who bring a friend could be entered into a drawing for cool stuff, or they could both receive a patch!
- Host a "Normal Friend Activity" A NFA is an event that you unit host as an opportunity to build relationship with both youth and adults. These events should be focused on fun and not on any of the traditional Scouting activities. It's a safe place for youth to invite their friends to check out the group without worrying about uniform and ceremonies. This gives an opportunity for a youth to make new friends and for adults to connect together without the pressure of an "ask" to join. What a great way to build relationship!
- ASK! according to the membership and marketing team, a survey of parents who never enrolled their children in Scouting revealed that most has either only been asked once or NEVER AT ALL. We can change that ! Just ask!

SERVICE AND GRATITUDE

Participating in service projects is one way that Scouts keep their promise "to help other people at all times" As we approach the holiday season, it is important to take time to consider all the good in our lives. Being of service is a great way to act on those feelings of gratitude. Scouts and their units can give back in many ways: service to the chartered organization, to the community, or to the world. Time spent on service projects should be enjoyable, age appropriate and relevant to help ensure a meaningful experience.

SOME WAY TO GIVE BACK TO THE CHARTERED ORGANIZATION:

- Conduct a clean-up project around the grounds, including litter pick-up and landscaping maintenance
- Help with set-up or break-down for a special service or event
- Offer to serve refreshments or hand out bulletins at a service if your chartered organization is a place of worship
- Ask if any members of the chartered organization need help with tasks like raking leaves or other yard maintenance

SOME WAYS TO GIVE BACK TO THE COMMUNITY"

- Perform a flag ceremony for a school event
- Collect food or supplies for a foodbank
- Make a deliver greeting cards for military personnel or nursing home patients
- volunteers for recovery efforts after storms or other disasters

SOME WAYS TO GIVE BACK TO OUR WORLD:

- Participate in beautification projects for parks or other public spaces
- Perform maintenance projects for your favorite campgrounds
- Hold a recyclable drive for paper, glass, aluminum, or plastic items
- Make animal habitats for a nature preserve

As with all Scouting events, always ask for permission before you begin . A brief discussion with the beneficiary can help ensure the intended project is necessary and safe.. Safety is essential in planning and executing service projects. A variety of resources are available to help ensure service project safety



Cub Scout Camping Changes




Effective Sept. 1, 2023, Cub Scout packs who are conducting their own overnight camping activities **may now camp up to two consecutive nights**.

This is a change from the earlier policy on **pack unit-coordinated camping**, which was previously limited to single overnight experiences.

The updated policy **also applies to Webelos and Arrow of Light dens**, who can now conduct campouts for up to two consecutive nights.

REQUIRED: at least **one registered adult leader trained in Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO)** who oversees the planning and is in attendance for the pack campout.









Highlights

- New scouts pay a one-time registration fee of \$25
- National and Council fees are paid for 12 months no more proration
- Families and Units will be notified about National and Council fees
- Units *can* choose to pay for scouts, or let families pay
