





Annual Recharter

- Annual recharter process opened as of Monday, October 2nd
- The process is completely online and available at <u>Internet Advancement</u>
- GGAC's YPT policy is stricter than the National BSA policy
- YPT and AB506 certification must be valid through the entire calendar year 2024 at time of recharter
- The new AB506 training can be accessed from the <u>California Scouting website</u>
- YPT & AB506 status for all registered members is always available on <u>Dropbox</u>.

Merit Badge or STEM/NOVA Counselor Recharter

Please fill out the recharter form before January 15th, 2024

If you have not filled this out before January 15th, 2024 and have not rechartered with any unit, then you will be dropped as a Merit badge or STEM/NOVA counselor for the 2024 year and have to reapply.

If you registered as a Merit Badge Counselor or STEM/NOVA Counselor **AFTER August 1, 2023**, then you **don't need to re-recharter** as your registration follows your initial registration date.



Background Checks

Criminal Background Checks will now be a prerequisite to an adult leader showing up in Scoutbook Roster

What's this mean to you:

It will take 5-7 business days before a leader shows up



Scouts BSA Rank Req. Changes

- Personal Safety Awareness training replaces
 CyberChip for Scout and Star
- No more 3-month wait between Palms
- Major changes in 14 Merit Badges, including First Aid, Sustainability, and Swimming
- Minor changes to 16 Merit Badges
- Effective Jan 1, 2024

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Presentation Content

What are "behind the scenes troop leaders?

 Few troops function with the minimum number of adult leaders: troop committee chair, two members of the troop committee, and a Scoutmaster. These leaders assist the troop in presenting the best program possible for the youth in the troop.

Who are the "behind the scenes troop leaders?

 Examples include but are not limited to: advancements chair, popcorn chair, finance chair, transportation coordinator, and others. Question: What are the roles of "behind the scenes leaders" in your troop?

Question: Bases on these answers are there any additional leadership positions which would enhance your troop program?

Question: Is it possible to have too many leaders? If so, how should a troop handle this situation?

Recruiting troop leaders

 They need to be told the job description and length of time they will be expected to serve in this capacity.

Question: What techniques have you found successful in recruiting troop leaders?

Question: Where have you been most successful in recruiting new troop leaders: parents of youth in the troop, former Scouts, Eagle Scouts, members of the sponsoring organization, others?

Recognizing troop leaders

All adults leaders in the troop should be recognized for their role in presenting the best Scouting program to the youth in the troop. These include:

- Certificates of appreciation (Scout Shop or created by the Scouts in the troop) presented in a frame, so i can be displayed rather than just filed away in a drawer.
- Scout mugs
- Patches from an event where the Scouter participated
- Memento made by a Scout(s) in the troop
- Providing a steak dinner on Saturday night for the adults that attended the monthly camp out

Question: How does your troop recognize adult leaders other than the Scoutmaster and assistant Scoutmaster(s)?

Adult leaders should be recognized at a Court-of-Honor or another troop family events, they should be recognized at the last troop meeting they will be attending.

To make the recognition meaningful to the adult volunteer, it should be presented by a Scout(s)

Question: When has your troop recognized the adult leaders in the troop?

Question: Who presented the recognition to the adult leaders? If not a Scout(s) why not?

To maintain good leadership in the troop, they must be:

- Trained
- Trusted
- Turned loose
- Thanked!

Leader Awards

Scout Leader's Training Award

Description: green on green knot on tan field with tan border

• Complete at least two (2) years of tenure as a registered adult leader in a Scout BSA troop.

Training:

- Completed basic training for any Scout BSA leader position
- Complete this is Scouting training
- Attend a university of Scouting (or equivalent), or attend at least four roundtables (or equivalent) during each year of the tenure used for this award.

Performance: Do the following during the tenure used for this award:

- Participate in an annual troop planning meeting in each year
- Serve as an adult leader in a troop that achieves at least the Bronze acceptable if the tenure used is prior to 2011
- Give primary leadership in meeting at least one troop Journey to Excellence objective in each year
- Participate in at least one additional supplemental or advanced training event at the council, area, region, or national level during the two (2) years

Scouter Key Award

Description: white on green knot on tan field with tan border

• Complete at least three (3) years of registered tenure as a Scoutaster within a five-year period. (This can include the tenure used earn the Scouter's Training Award.)

Training:

- Completed basic training for Scoutmasters
- Complete this is Scouting training
- Attend a university of Scouting (or equivalent), or attend at least four roundtables (or equivalent) during each year of the tenure used for this award.

Performance: Do the following during the tenure used for this award:

- Achieve at least the Silver level of Journey to Excellence for at least two (2) years. The Quality Unit Award is acceptable if the tenure used is prior to 2011
- Earn the National Outdoor Challenge Award at least once
- Conduct an annual troop planning session and have a published troop meeting/activity schedule for the troop's parents in each year
- Participate in a least one additional supplemental or advanced training event at the council, area, region, or national level



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Cub Scout Program Changes

Taking Effect June 1, 2024



Areas of Opportunity



- **BOBCAT**
- One set of requirements is ineffective
- What to do with returning Cub Scouts
- · Rank or not a rank?



ADVENTURES

- Disjointed required adventure topics
- Inconsistent number of adventures for each rank
- Volunteers want more elective adventures



WEBELOS (4TH/5TH GRADE)

- Length of Webelos program
- Does not follow the pattern of other ranks
- · Purpose of the program



AWARDS

- Awards are not in the direct line of sight of Den Leaders
- Average attachment rate of 1.5%
- Awards do not drive behavior

Short Story

Bobcat will no longer be a badge that is earned once when a Cub Scout joins. It will become a required Adventure for each rank and earned each year.

Cub Scout Adventures have been improved to make it easier to deliver the program to multi-rank dens or as a Pack. To earn each rank in Cub Scouting will require a Cub Scout to earn the six required Adventures and two elective Adventures.

Webelos and Arrow of Light will be separated. Webelos becomes the 4th-grade program in Cub Scouting. Arrow of Light becomes a stand-alone badge of rank for 5th graders and will no longer be associated with Webelos.

Cub Scouts Awards will be reimagined as Cub Scout Adventures. Topics like camping, STEM, and range and target sports will remain and are reimagined into elective Adventures that can be used towards earning a badge of rank.

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2024-2025 Cub Scout Badges of Rank **Requirements**

The Bobcat Adventure is designed to be the first required Adventure. Each badge of rank is earned by completing six required and two elective Adventures. The six required Adventures are focused on the aims and focus areas of the BSA.



Awards and More Survey

Survey was sent to 18,376 parents and 36,487 den

leaders 3,637 people responded: 6.6% response rate

95% (+/- 1.7%) confidence level

Awards are not driving behavior
Of those who earned the awards, 2/3
see them as recognition, not an
incentive.

Not an awareness issue

Of those who did not earn the award, 50% indicated that they knew about the award but still chose not to do it.

STEM NOVA Awards



- Over 50% of parents and Cub Scout leaders felt that STEM as a topic was important to be part of Scouting
- 47% of leaders said it should be an Adventure

• 32% had no preference

Required Adventure Survey

The survey was sent to 36,963 den leaders

3,880 people responded, a 10.5% response rate

95% (+/- 1.5%) confidence level
